Trees Across Boulder

offers eight different tree species that thrive in Boulder's climate for \$50 each. These trees require little water compared to others. Saplings come balled and burlapped and planting and maintenance instructions are provided.

Garden-in-a-Box

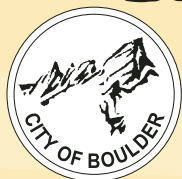
program provides a simple solution for creating a low-water garden. The program offers three low-cost, professionally designed, pre-planned, xeric gardens that come with 30 to 40 plants and planting and maintenance instructions. Prices range between \$65 and \$125.

FREE Water-Wise Landscape Seminars

are offered between April 6 and April 11. The two-hour seminars, taught by a local landscape professional, provide valuable information on items ranging from xeriscaping for beginners and experts to plant selection.

Slow the Flow Colorado

provides FREE irrigation audits for residents and homeowner associations within the city of Boulder. A trained auditor will visit your location and provide custom information on items like sprinkler system efficiency and watering schedules. Audit requests can be submitted year round, but they only take place between June and August and are scheduled on a first come, first serve basis.
